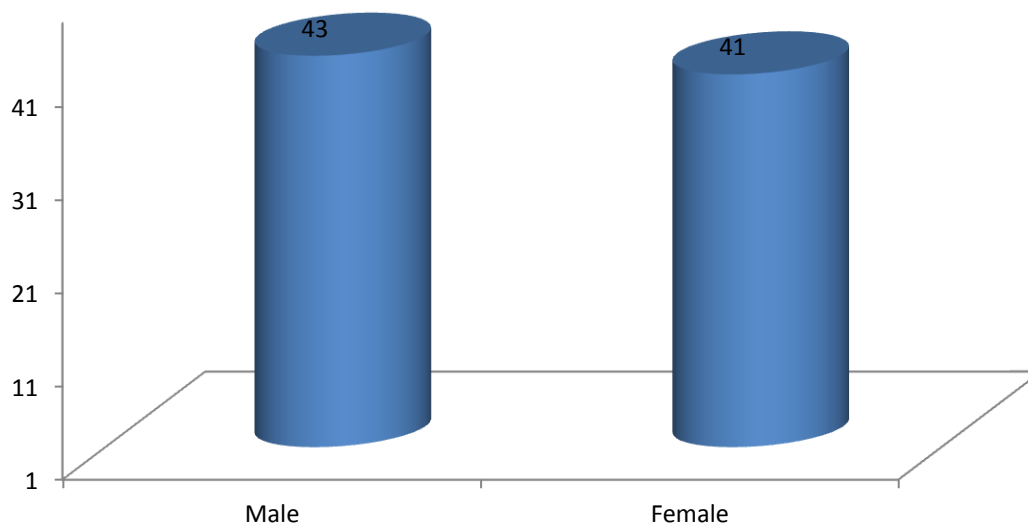


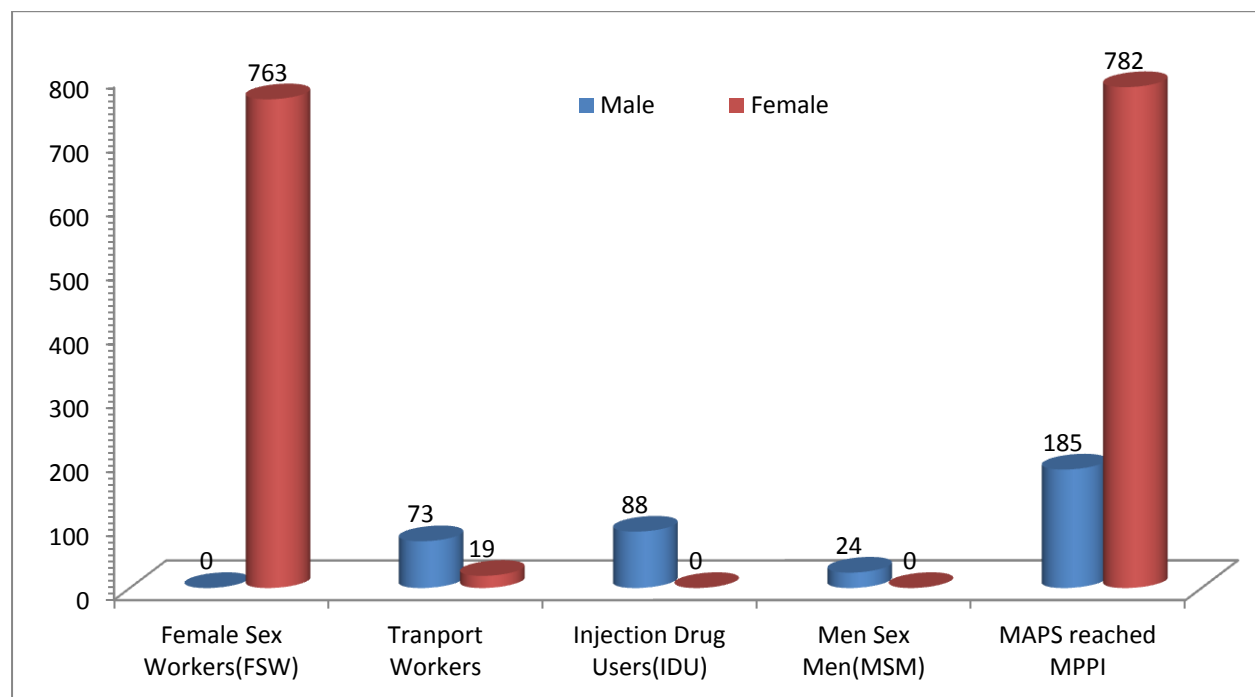

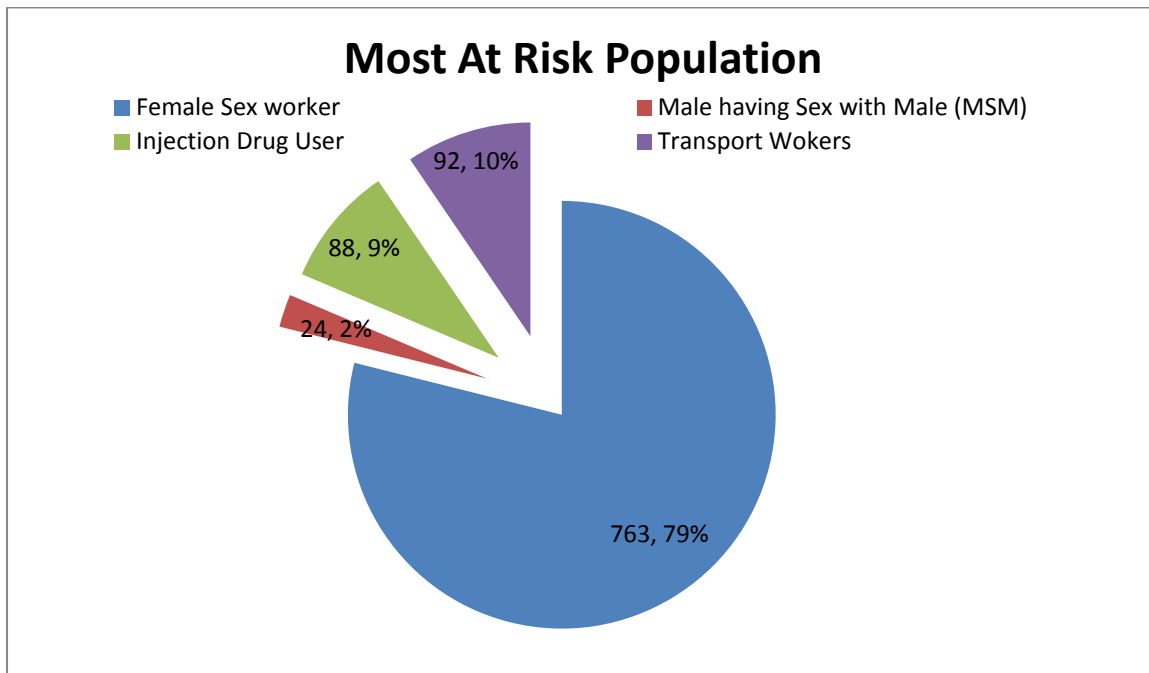
HIV/AIDS Peer Education Session



FIRST trained 84 peer educators (43 male, 41 female) on HIV/AIDS transmission and prevention. The peer educators work as community service provide (CSP) to provide knowledge and skills to young people, women of reproductive age and pregnant women to take positive action.

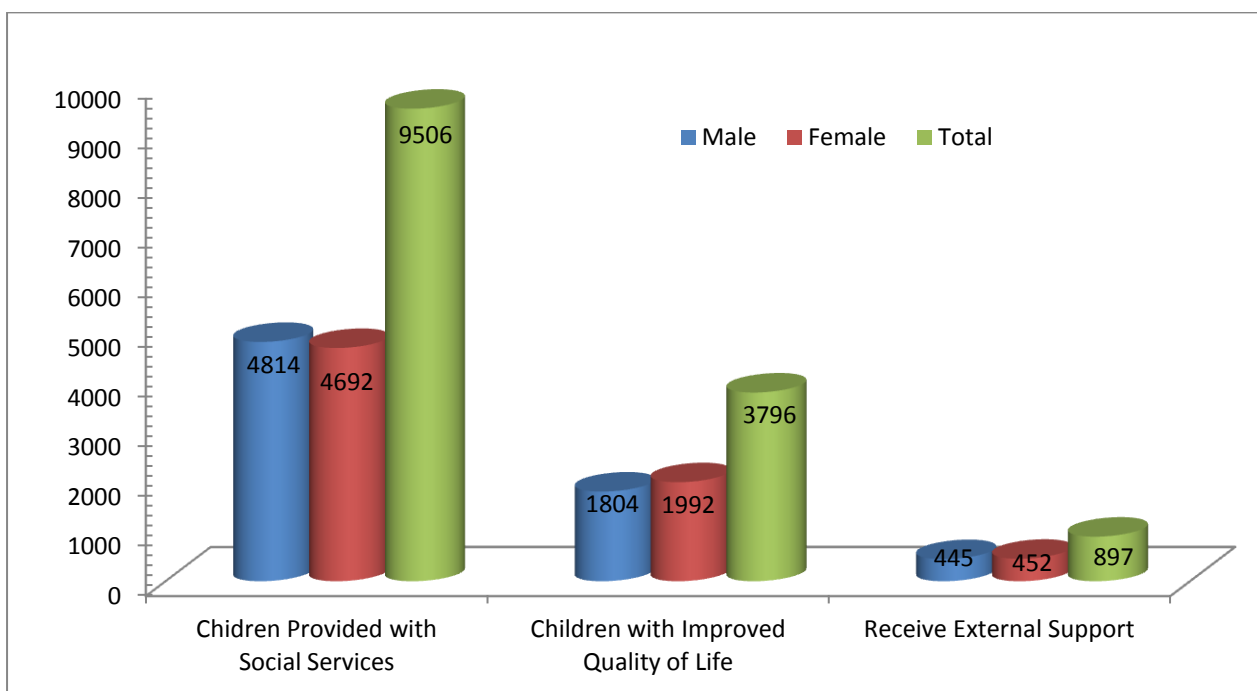
Most At Risk Population (MARPs)





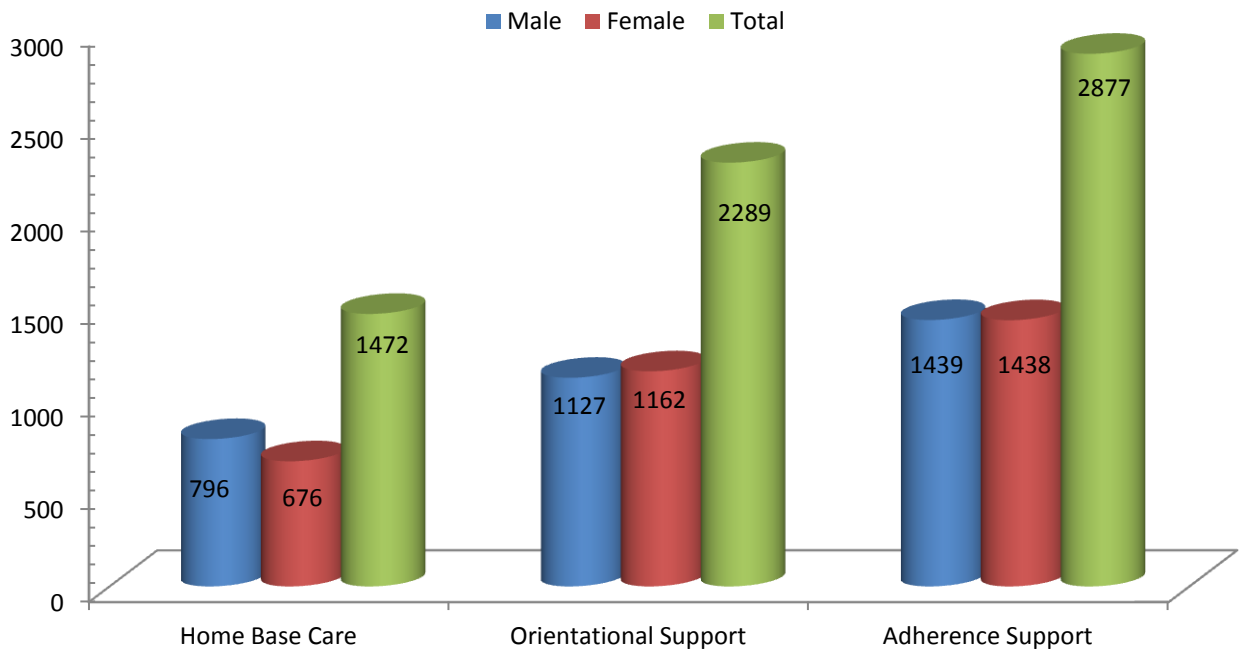
A total number of 967 people (Male 185, Female 782) were reached using minimum prevention package of intervention (MPPI). The break down includes 763 Female Sex Workers (FSW), 92 transport workers (73male, 19female), 88 Injection Drug Users (IDU) and 24 male having Sex with Male (MSM).

Vulnerable Children (VC) Intervention



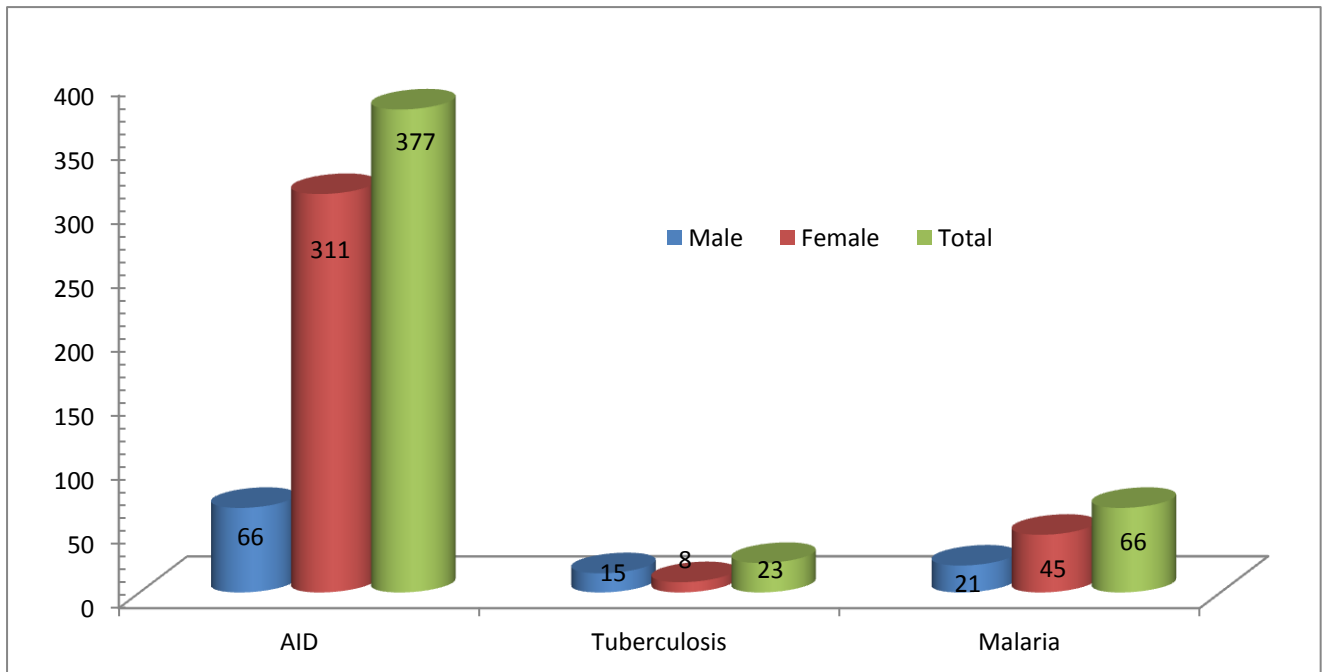
A total of 9,506 children (male 4,814 and female 4,692) were reached with a comprehensive care package. Only 3,796 (male 1,804, female 1,992) had improved quality of life. Other support given include, linkages to other services such as birth registration, immunization etc

Palletive Care:

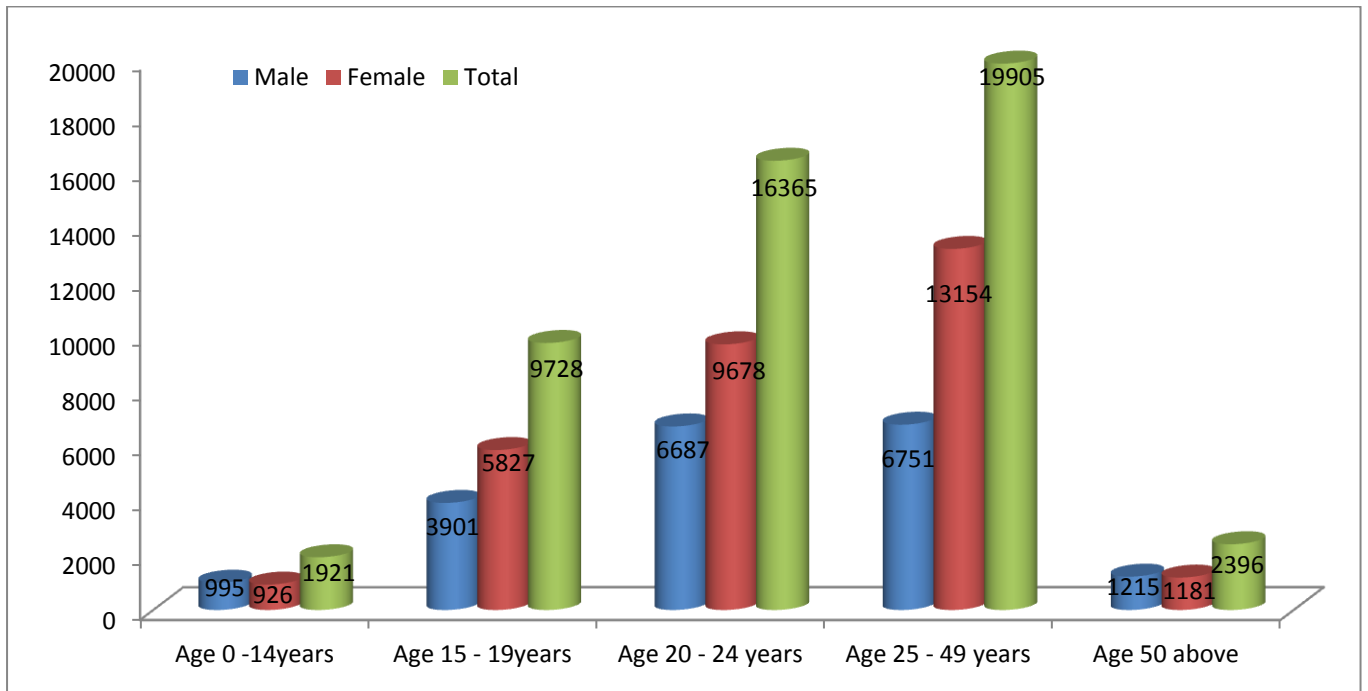


A total number of 1472 (male 796, female 676) that are HIV positive received home based care. Also, adherence support was given to 2,877 (male 1439 and female 1438) of the people living with HIV/AIDS.

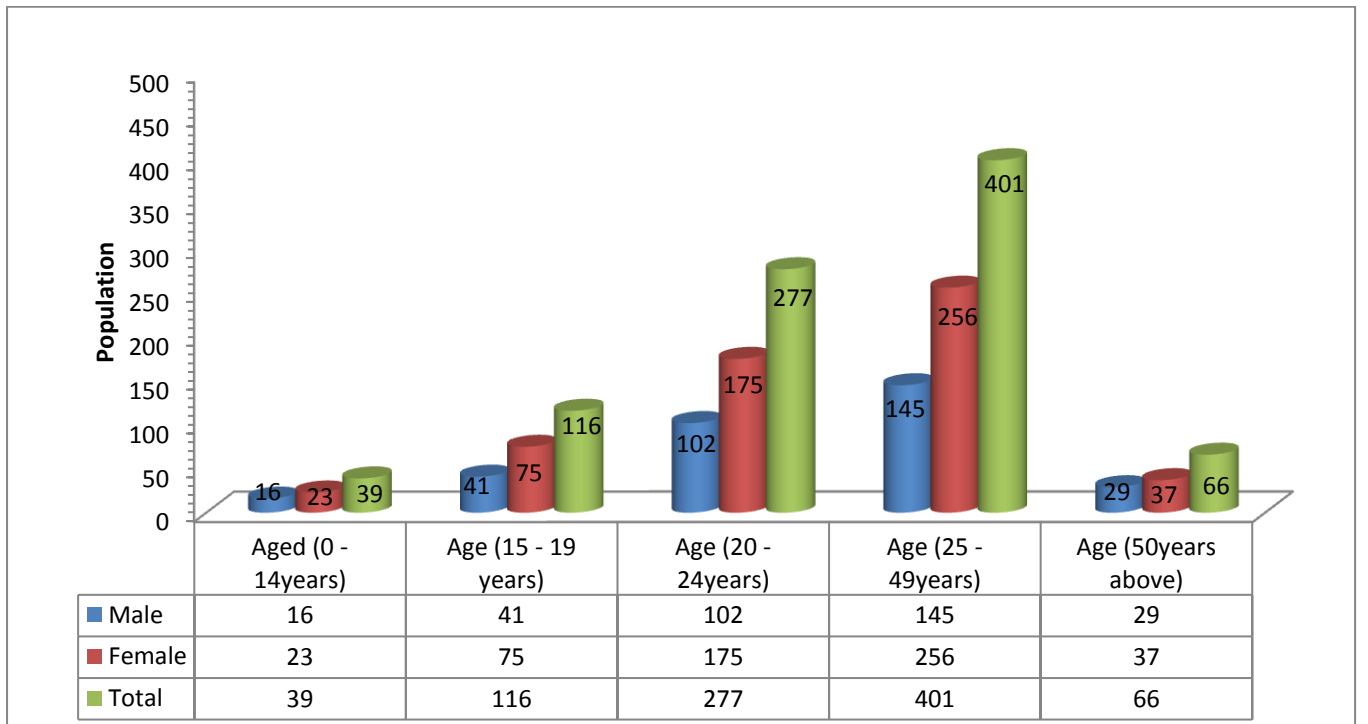

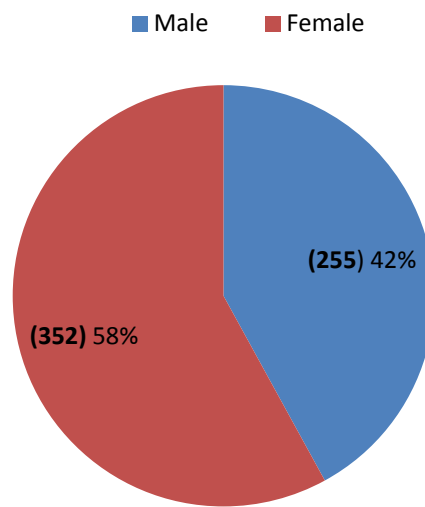


The chart shows number of person who were tested and receive result by age and sex. A total of 40,624 (Male 15,031 and Female 25,593) people were reached.

Individual Tested Positive by Age and Sex

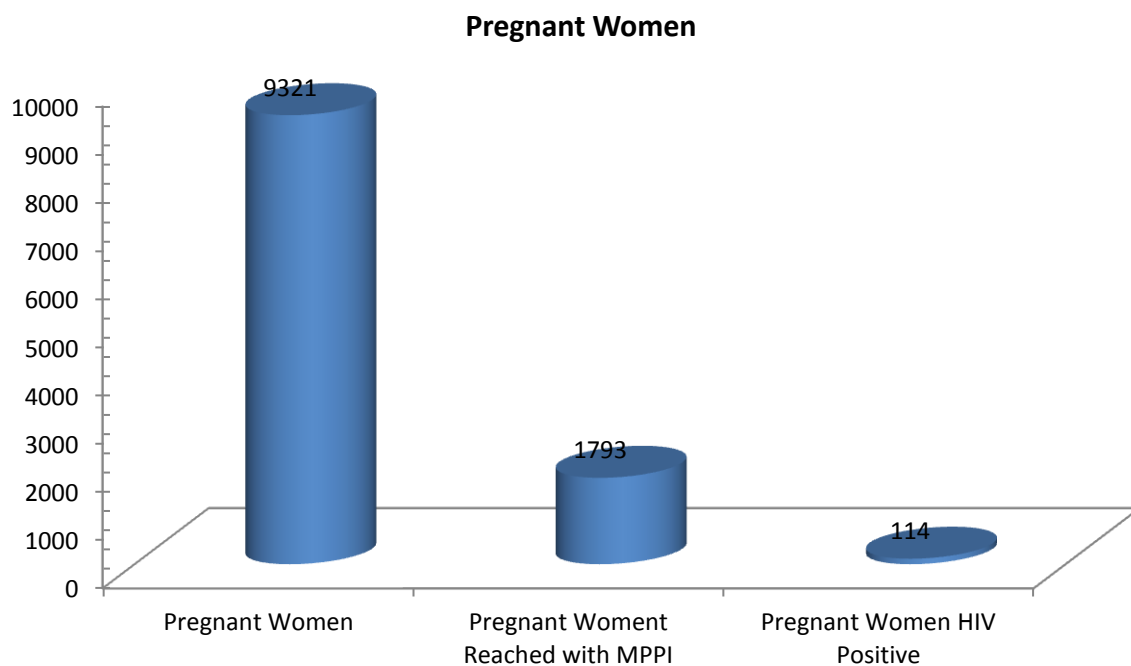


Positive clients by Sex

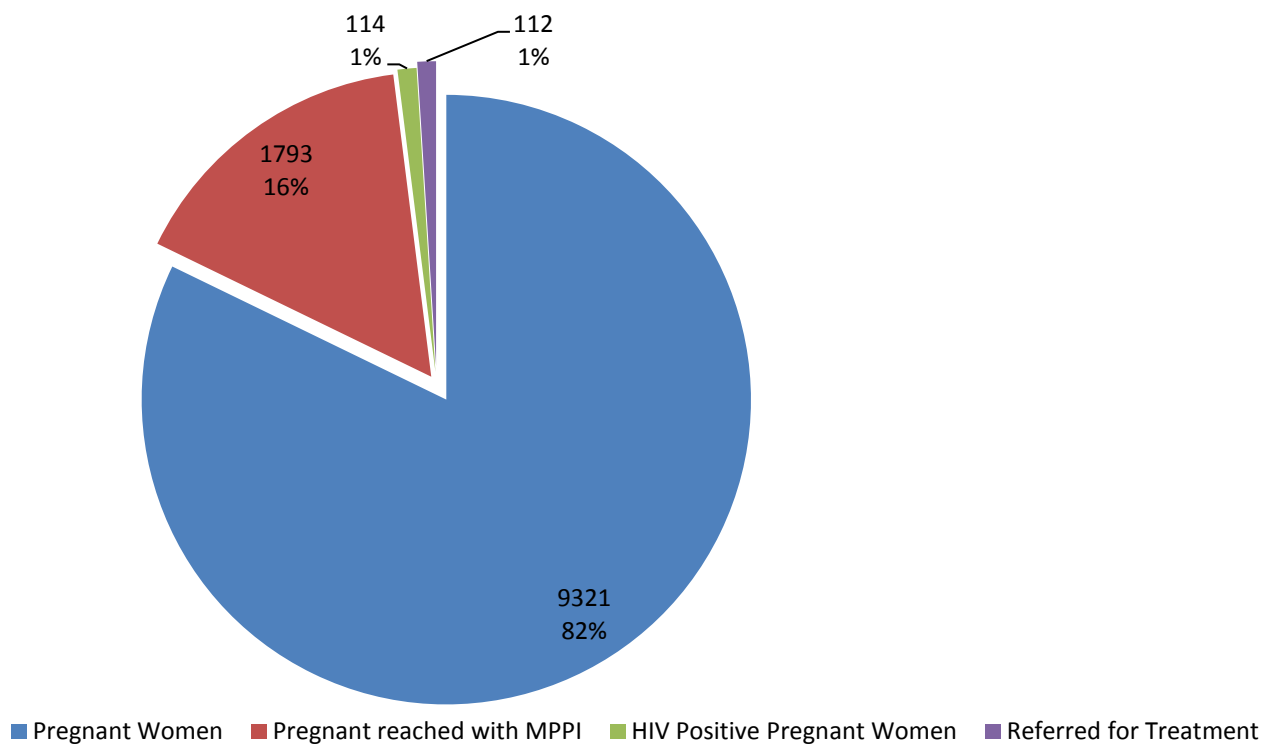


FIRST reached 899 (male 255, Female 352) individual tested positive. These people have been referred for treatment and care.

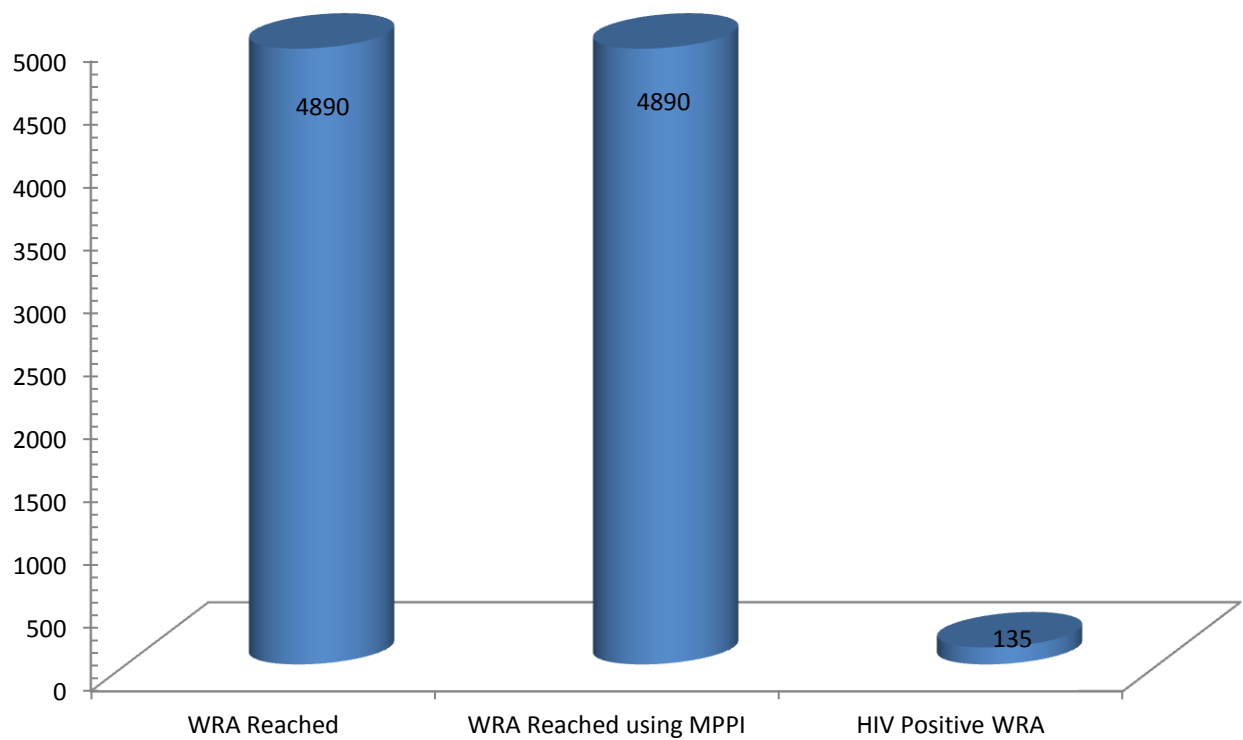
PMTCT Demand Creation



A total of 9,321 pregnant women were reached. Only 1,793 were reached through minimum package of prevention intervention strategy. Total of 114 were found positive and have enrolled for treatment.



Women of Reproductive Age (WRA)



To increase demand creation on PMTCT, 4890 women of reproductive health were reached using minimum package prevention of intervention. Total of 135 were found positive and have been enrolled for treatment .
